# PLAYING THE GAME

The wheel spins, the ball clickety-clacks and you're immediately immersed in one of the most exciting games on the casino floor.

Roulette is a French word meaning "Little Wheel" and is indeed a popular casino game in France and most of Europe. Players may choose to place bets on a single number or various groupings of numbers or the colors red and black. The croupier (roulette dealer) spins the wheel in one direction, and then propels the ball in a groove inside the edge of the wheel in the opposite direction. As the ball loses its momentum, it falls towards the wheel itself, and bounces around until it falls into one of the numbered slots.

Most roulette wheels in America have 38 equally-spaced compartments on the wheel with thirty-six (36) numbers from 1 to 36, plus 0 and 00. The numbers are alternately colored red and black with 0 and 00 colored green. The Roulette layout matches the numbers and colors of the Roulette wheel and is where players place their bets. Casino may offer wheels with 39 equally spaced compartments with thirty-six (36) numbers from 1 to 36, plus 0, 00 and 000 colored green.

Players may place bets on any number, combination of numbers or section of numbers, red or black colors, odd or even numbers or a 0, 00 and/or 000, where applicable, with colored Roulette chips.

Roulette is different from other table games in that, because of the number of players possible at a time and the varied number of bets, Roulette-only chips are sold as a single color to each player. This helps to differentiate between them.

Also, the value of each chip can vary depending on the table minimum. The Roulette chips have no value except at the specific table they were sold and must be redeemed at the same table prior to leaving the game. Regular casino chips can also be used at the discretion of table staff, and are typically welcomed on 'outside' bets such as red or black, even or odd, high or low, and columns bets.

As the ball begins to slow, the dealer signals the end of betting by saying, "No more bets," and waving their hands over the table. Players are responsible for placing their chips on their desired wagers before the end of betting is called.

After the ball falls into a number on the Roulette wheel, the dealer will mark that number on the layout, clear all losing bets and pay all winning bets accordingly.
